Owning a C8 Z51, known as an incredibly high-performance ride, didn't concern Paul and Darry Bova when they opened their Arctic White 2020 coupe. With great confidence, these big engine fans drove home in the first-ever Chevrolet Corvette with a mid-engine placement.

After all, the Bovas' life together has been built around friends, lots of physical activities and, of course, fun, beautiful vehicles.

But even with all those extracurricular possibilities, they always appreciate an occasional adventure.

Sixty-two years ago, when they started dating, Darry quickly observed that her new beau seemed to have a lot of interest in vehicles. So it was no surprise at all when a strong theme involving automobiles followed them into married life.

In 1970, these native New Yorkers bought one of America's greatest sports cars – a 1964 Stingray convertible.

Through the years, they also owned keys for lots of other ignitions – from street cars, race cars and Mustangs to Ferraris.

When they started a family, Paul had a plan for all three of their children – all sons. When each one reached age 15, Paul tackled the restoration efforts of their first cars with each son.

The family garage housed two Mustangs and one Camaro while each one was brought back to life.
