

FAST Getting Set for Kick-Off

With less than a month remaining before the February 20 kick-off of the 2010 Sunoco Florida All Stars Tour, the series' cofounders are confident that the new 12race, six-track program will provide a critical lifeline for the state's Late Model Stock Car scene. Dick Anderson, Wayne Anderson, and Alan Bruns visited the club at its January 27 meeting to provide an update on the formation of the exciting new racing program, and to share the objectives they have for it. In introducing the trio of FAST originators, President Gerry Hafer commented that feedback from the local racing community indicates that there is little doubt about the need for the series, as evidenced by conflicting track schedules, dwindling car counts, and an eroding fan base. Florida is fortunate, he noted, to have the elite of the state's Late Model Stock Car world willing to step to the plate and organize what promises

to be a major step forward for local stock car racing.

Speaking as the elder statesman of Florida racing, Dick Anderson credited his son Wayne with having the foresight to lay the groundwork for FAST, and Central Florida businessman and multi-track racing champion Alan Bruns for jumping onboard to help structure the series. Anderson explained that FAST represents the first time in recent history that the principal asphalt tracks in Central Florida have been willing to come together and hammer out agreements on schedules, rules, and administrative issues. Wavne Anderson likewise credited the tracks for being willing to face the problems evident in the sport, expressing confidence that the twelve FAST races will produce full-field car counts and probably the highest quality of racing seen in the state for quite awhile.

Alan Bruns also provided a recap of one of the keynote ingredients in the FAST program—a strong Rookie Program. Sponsored by Lakeland-based RaceCar Engineering, this portion of the FAST format will provide enhanced visibility for the "up-and-comers" in the sport, and

will help attract new drivers to compete in the series. "These new, younger drivers are the future of the sport," he stressed, "and we're going to do a lot to showcase their talents." He noted that the series will crown a "Rookie of the Year" at the end of the season—a credential that will carry some weight

on a young racer's resume.

Both Wayne and Dick Anderson noted that funding for the series has been provided by a group of corporate sponsors, with Sunoco Racing Fuels stepping in as title sponsor for the entire series. Other corporate sponsors include RadioHead Racing Communications, BLP Products, Bruns Inc. General Contractors, Force V Florida, RaceCar Engineering, Solar 1st Fafco and Discount Propane, Sonny's Bar-B-Q, and Dynomite Dynamometers.

Since the first race in the series will be held at Citrus County Speedway in Inverness, and since this track is relatively close to The Villages, Special Events Coordinator Wendy Touchette later in the meeting announced plans to organize a car pool caravan for the February 20 event. It is an afternoon event, with qualifying to take place at 3:30 pm and the 100-lap FAST feature scheduled to start at 5:00 pm. Discounted pricing has been provided by the track (\$7 per person for 20 or more, \$6 per person for 30 or more). Details will follow.

Gerry Hafer also observed that a website (www.floridaallstarstour.com) has been developed for the Tour, and that the full-race schedule is posted on the site. As detailed schedules for each event are developed, he reported, the information will be made available on the site. Driver information is being added as registrations are received, and a full rundown of each

event's qualifying times and race results will be posted immediately after each event. Other information available via the website includes a continually updated "Rookies" section tracking the performance of this group of competitors, a dedicated Sponsor page with links to sponsor's websites, and the tour's official rules package and format information.





Looking Ahead to our February 24 Meeting

Our February 24 meeting will feature an appearance from NIC Racing Team's driver Nic Fernandez, Speedway Park's Rookie of the Year for 2009. A proven veteran at age 8, this young go-kart racer led the points in his class in 2009, after completing his first official points-paying race in April of that year. During the 2009 season, Nic was a force at this local venue, with five wins, two second place finishes, and three third place finishes. But he's not just a racer...as a student at The Villages Charter

School, Nic maintains Honor Roll status in the second grade, and has a secondary passion for baseball.

Nic and his dad, George, form the nucleus of NIC Racing, and they count the rest of the family...Mom Stephanie and Sister Ali...among their biggest fans and supporters. They're looking forward to continuing their success at the local Fruitland Park track, as they build for the future.


In keeping with our club's goal of learning about local racers, we welcome NIC Racing Team to Colony Cottage and look forward to hearing about their family operation.




Welcome, New Members

The Villages Cup is Coming



At our January 27 meeting, several representatives of Speedway Park in Fruitland Park, just adjacent to The Villages and the racing venue closest to our club, joined us with a great display of go-karts. Marty Ruser and Terry Turman provided an overview of the new dev elopements at the track, and offered club members a variety of opportunities to get involved with the operation of the track. Both Marty and Terry spoke passionately about the history of the track and its place in family activities, and invited everyone to attend the regular racing programs on the first and third Saturdays of the month.

Subsequent to the meeting, Speedway Park officials contacted the club and extended an offer for any interested club members to come to the track on a pre-arranged day and "test drive" a specially prepared golf kart on their track (no, Wendy, that doesn't mean the karts will be painted to match Tony Stewart's 2010 paint scheme). We jumped on the opportunity, sent an email to all members, and immediately compiled a list of 25 (and growing) racing enthusiasts eager to take their turn behind the wheel.

Now comes the fun part: With that many folks vying for seat time on what will probably only be a stable of 4 or 5 karts, we'll need to put some thought into for-

matting the event. Here's where we get creative! We're thinking about structuring the day into a series of heat races, probably multiple rounds, gradually filtering down to A-Main and B-Main (maybe even a C-Main) features followed by a two-car or three-car shootout to determine "The Villages Cup Champion." The final structure, of course, will be determined by the number of drivers signing up to participate. Stay tuned to the website for more information on the format, cost (we're expecting to set a nominal fee to cover some of the expenses), and scheduling of this highly competitive venture. 


