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# **George Wagner—Northeast Standout**



**February 6**—Well, we did it again...we reached into our ranks of outstanding and multi-talented members and came up with a winner in the form of George Wagner. If you were with us at the February meeting, you were treated to a thorough recounting of George's illustrious career racing in the Modified and Sportsman Divisions up in the Northeast.

George competed from 1962 to 1982 at many of the great tracks of the Northeast, like Islip, Freeport, West Hampton, and Riverhead, enjoying the opportunity to race against many of the greatest names in area stock car racing. Many of these drivers, like Charlie Jarzombek, Richie Evans, Tom Baldwin, Greg Sacks, and, of course, Buzzie Reutimann. George shared an incredible string of stories about the "old days" of racing in the 60s, 70s, and early 80s, including a slew of tales about the rougher side of the sport as it was "back in the day."

George traced his involvement in racing from around 1950, when he had the opportunity to watch televised events on a 10" TV screen. After starting to attend racing at age 12, he was hooked, and eventually acquired his first car in 1962 at a cost of \$50, racing it in the Novice Division at Freeport Speedway where he learned the tips and techniques of stock car racing. Through the years, George advanced upward through various classes, eventually hitting the Modified ranks in the late1960s. Along the way, he also spent some time racing Midgets, competing against many of the local greats, including eventual Indianapolis competitor Jerry Carl.

To say George was successful would be an understatement. He was recog-

nized as NASCAR Modified Sportsman Champion at Islip Speedway in 1968 and Co Champion at Freeport Speedway in 1975. These days, George stays involved through his son George III who is an active pit crew member, and his two grandsons, both of whom are involved in NASCAR racing, one with Joe Gibbs Racing, the other with Kyle Busch Racing in the Truck Series.

Indeed, a Selection Committee consisting of Fred Coenen and Jim Boyd sprang into action almost immediately, and has developed a slate of candidates to be proposed for election at the March Meeting. Jerry Conkle has accepted the nomination for President/Crew Chief, with Gary Civiletti to be


nominated for the Special Events Coordinator position and Dave Allen for the Vice President position.

# **Pit Crew Approves Two Contributions**

At our February 6 meeting, members were asked to vote on two contributions for 2013, and unanimous approval was given to \$250 awards to Camp Boggy Creek and Villages Honor Flight. Both of these organizations are considered to be great, extremely worthy causes, with strong connections to The Villages and to our members.

Many of you are aware that our own Wayne Nolan is planning to participate in a 2013 Honor Flight, so be sure to wish him well. With respect to Camp Boggy Creek, many of us have visited this fantastic facility for seriously ill children down in Eustis, and have been moved by its mission. Our Pit Crew has discussed the possibility of a return visit later this year, so stay tuned.

As you all know, community support has been, and continues to be, one of our main objectives as a club. We've taken this seriously since our late-2006 start-up, and we've been able to produce a pretty substantial track record.

Our community support has taken several approaches, ranging from outright charitable contributions like the two approved at our February meeting, to sponsorships for race teams and drivers, to general support to the area racing community, to scholarships for area college-bound high school graduates.

In developing recommendations for support, our Pit Crew seeks to make certain that whatever we're doing conforms to our established mission/vision statestatement. (If you haven't looked at that lately, you can find it on or website's "About Us" page.)

So, back to our track record. Here's what we've done so far:

- Contributions to charities (Camp Boggy Creek, Victory Junction Gang, Honor Flight, Operation Shoe Box, etc.) over \$6,000.
- Direct support to drivers and race teams \$8,400.
- General support to the racing community (ads, Speedway Park donations, etc.) - \$2,200.
- Scholarships \$2,000.

Not bad, for little over six years of activity! And here's another quick fact...23 different drivers have piloted cars with our club logo!



#### **Little-Known Travel Facts**



Many of you have heard of the village named Intercourse, in Lancaster County, Pennsylvania. And you've probably speculated on the origin of the name. Well, as your intrepid newsletter editor, I took it upon

myself to research the subject, and came up with this explanation, courtesy of "Intercourse News, April-May 2011 edition (Vol. 43, No. 2): (This is quoted material...I didn't make it up! Here goes:

The road from Washington to Erie intersected in the middle. The joining or intercourse of these two roads is claimed by some to be the basis for naming the town Intercourse.
