

So You Don't Need to Look it up!

Here, courtesy of USAToday, is a recap of the 2006 season's official final standings contrasted to what the final standings would have been under the pre-2004 points system. Note, for example, that Tony Stewart's performance over the final ten events would have put him fourth under the "old" method, while he missed "The Chase" under the new format. Oh, well.
