Our guest speaker will be Josh Hart, owner/driver of the R+L Carriers / TechNet NHRA Top Fuel Dragster.

Josh was born in Huntington, Indiana. In 2010 Josh and his wife moved to Ocala and founded Burnyzz Speed Shop.

Hart became an NHRA drag racer in 2011, racing in the sportsman class. After earning his Top Alcohol Dragster license in 2015, Josh won several national event titles and many regional races. Hart won the NHRA Regional Champions in 2017 and is a two-time NHRA U.S. Nationals winner (2018–19).

After earning his Top Fuel license in 2020, driving for Bob Vandergriff Racing, Hart elected to start his own Top Fuel Dragster race team in 2021. In his first NHRA Top Fuel race as owner/driver, Josh won the 2021 NHRA Gatornationals at Gainesville Raceway.

The Josh Hart Racing team is now based in Brownsburg, Indiana.

Legends Stock Car Show & Parade at Daytona Beach Shores February 18


