The 2010 Villages Cup

The field has been reset for the Sunday, April 18 running of The 2010 Villages Cup at Speedway Park. Many of you were geared up to participate—either as competitors, support teams, or just plain spectators—at the originally-scheduled March 21 event, but a wave of showers, followed by an afternoon of heavy rain, resulted in highly unfavorable track conditions at the clay-based racetrack over in Fruitland Park. One of the truly unfortunate results of this postponement is that many of the original competitors are no longer available for the April 18 date but, on the flip side, a number of competitors who were not available on March 21 can now fill in! So, we're up to a complement of 32 available slot assignments, and we're planning a full racing schedule of 14 heats, a consolation, and a championship feature.

On an administrative note, we cannot say enough about the hospitality provided by the officials and management of Speedway Park in planning and arranging this first-of-its-kind event. They're graciously providing the go-karts and the basic safety equipment, and have gone above and beyond the call to assist in arranging the logistics for what we're certain will be another great event for our club. It's fortunate for us that we have a racing facility as fine as Speedway Park at our doorstep!

And, while we're on the subject, please pay particular attention to Wendy's Special Events announcements for the month of April...we're organizing a trip to the regular racing show at Speedway Park on the night before The 2010 Villages Cup, and we're planning to make it a sponsorship night for Nic Fernandez—our February featured speaker—and his race team. Come on out and help us cheer this rising star on as he challenges the track!

Wayne Anderson—2 for 3 in FAST Series

Auburndale Speedway, Mar. 20, 2010—After putting up winning performances in the first two Sunoco Florida All Stars Tour events, Wildwood's Wayne Anderson appeared to be on track for a third impressive finish at Auburndale Speedway on March 20. It was not to be, however, after an early skirmish forced him to the rear of the field and a late-race accident led to his exit

from the field. Between laps 2 and 65, Anderson had been charging back through the field on the tough quarter-mile track, reaching fourth place when the accident occurred. He was awarded 22nd position in the finishing order, but the third place finish of rookie Austin Kirkpatrick caused Anderson to drop to second place in the 2010 series standings. Kirkpatrick has been one of the most consistent campaigners in the series, finishing three times in the top 10 to lead the points by five over Anderson. Late Model veteran and Florida standout Jeff Scofield won the 3/20 feature, leading all 100 laps. Randy Anderson, meanwhile, climbed to fourth place in the 2010 standings, while C.J. Calabrese dropped to eighth place. Kirkpatrick, Randy Anderson, and Calabrese all drive cars produced by Wayne Anderson Racing in Wildwood.

Kirkpatrick and Randy Anderson are also setting the pace in the competition for the Sunoco FAST Rookie of the Year honors. Anderson earned "Rookie of the Race" honors at the season opener on February 20, while Kirkpatrick grabbed the trophy on March 6 and March 20.

The next scheduled event on the Sunoco FAST schedule is the Sonny's Bar-B-Q 100 slated for Saturday, May 1 at Citrus County Speedway in nearby Inverness. Problems at Charlotte County Motorsports Park in Punta Gorda forced cancellation of the fourth race in the series; officials hope to reschedule this event later in the year.

Update on Club Favorites

Dick Anderson—Look out, Florida Late Model Racing Community...he's back! The "King of the Florida Short Tracks" has reclaimed his throne! After spending a few months in late 2009 and early 2010 preparing, Dick Anderson has returned to competition in his legendary black number 92 Super Late Model, and quickly proved he can still get it done. At Orlando Speedworld on April 2, he started on the outside pole in the Late Model feature, took the lead in turn one of the first lap, and led all the way to the checkers for his first win after a three-year selfinduced layoff. In a post race interview, Dick commented, "They had some really good cars in the field, so I knew I had to get up on the wheel pretty quick!" And that's exactly what he did, leading all the way to the checkers in a style that many longtime Florida race fans have missed for a few years.

Buzzie Reutimann—He'll be 69 years young on May 7 of this year, but he continues to prove that age doesn't matter (at least in his case!) Buzzie launched another year of what will undoubtedly be a successful schedule of racing in the Open Wheel Modified ranks at East Bay Raceway Park on March 13, winning his heat race and the feature. The following week, he again won his heat race, but

ran into some difficulty in the feature. Buzzie commented afterward that, "It was one of those nights...I hit everything but the Winner's Circle!"

He returned to East Bay on April 10, winning his third heat race of the year and placing second in the feature. His early season success puts him atop the leader board in the Open Wheel Modifieds at Eastbay, with an average finish of 4th for the first three events.

Buzzie expects to return to Ocala Speedway within a few weeks...as soon as he gets his "chrome car" back from David!

Steve Griffin—Steve has rejoined the Mini-Stock ranks after a year and a half layoff, and he's quickly proven that he hasn't skipped a beat! The 2008 Citrus County Speedway Champion opened up his 2010 season at Orlando Speedworld on March 26 with a commanding win in the Feature race, and has at this point built a three-race winning streak at this demanding 3/8 mile asphalt oval. Steve's new racecar (pictured at right) is similar in appearance to the one our club sponsored several years ago over at Citrus County Speedway, and it's evidently just as fast!



Harold Bedell—Another ageless racer and club favorite—Harold Bedell—continues to show up strong in the Florida Slingshots series. Driving his familiar red number 24, Harold competed in the feature event during

Flying Cars?...Not Necessarily New to NASCAR!

After the Carl Edwards-Brad Keselowski dust-up a few weeks ago at Atlanta, a lot of attention was focused on the C.O.T. and the more-frequent-than-expected occurrences of cars getting airborne during on-track accidents. A host of experts on aerodynamics weighed in almost immediately on the causes and potential corrections, and NASCAR is well on the way to addressing the situation (again).

In the meantime, it might be a good idea to take a look at some of the research being done by a group of MIT students. They've created—and successfully flown—what's been labeled the Terrafugia Transition Roadable Aircraft. In other words, a flying car, and they're now taking orders for delivery of the "roadable planes" as early as 2011.

Here's what they look like:





For \$10,000 down, you can get on the list to order one of these beauties! Imagine tooling around (or over?) The Villages in one of these. If you want to see it in action, Google "terrafugia" and you'll find the YouTube video of the recent test flight.

Here's a cool way to control driving speed!

...at least until everybody catches on! Speed bumps are one way to do it, increased sheriff patrols are another. Since common sense has become a sort of rare commodity in traffic flow these days, it seems like everybody is on the lookout for ways to slow things down a bit (except, of course, on the race track). Well, some traffic engineers in Canada have come up with a dramatic way to give drivers in areas prone to high speeds something to focus on so that they take it easy. Imagine coming up on something like this as you're driving along...



You'd probably slow down. But here's the real "skinny" on the idea...



It might work for a day or two for us "regulars," but it would help with the visitors, don't you think?

So you don't need to look it up...

Fresh off of our March 12 trip to the 2010 NHRA Tire Kingdom Gatornationals in Gainesville, we thought it would be interesting to hit you all with a series of facts, figures, and just plain trivia about NHRA competition. So here's some food for thought, courtesy of www.nhra.net, and they're all presented as answers to that age-old question: Did you know...?

- ... that the nitro methane-powered engines of NHRA Top Fuel dragsters and Funny Cars produce approximately 7,000 horse-power, about 37 times that of the average street car?
- ... that one cylinder of the eight cylinders of a Top Fuel dragster or a Funny Car produces 750 horsepower, equaling the entire horsepower output of a NASCAR engine?
- ... that the gasoline-powered engines of NHRA Pro Stock cars produce about 1,200 horsepower, about eight times that of the average street car?
- ... that an NHRA Top Fuel dragster accelerates from 0 to 100 mph in less than .8-second, almost 11 seconds quicker than it takes a production Porsche 911 Turbo to reach the same speed?
- ... that an NHRA Top Fuel dragster leaves the starting line with a force nearly five times that of gravity, the same force of the space shuttle when it leaves the launching pad at Cape Canaveral?
- ... that an NHRA Funny Car is slowed by a reverse force more than seven times that of gravity when both parachutes deploy simultaneously?
- ... that NHRA Top Fuel dragsters and Funny Cars consume between four and five gallons of fuel during a quarter-mile run, which is equivalent to between 16 and 20 gallons per mile?
- ... that NHRA Top Fuel dragsters and Funny Cars use between 10 and 12 gallons of fuel for a complete pass, including the burnout, backup to the starting line, and quarter-mile run?
- ... that NHRA Top Fuel dragsters and Funny Cars travel the length of more than four football fields in less than five seconds?
- ... that NHRA Top Fuel dragsters can exceed 280 mph in just 660 feet?
- ... that from a standing start, NHRA Top Fuel dragsters accelerate faster than a jumbo jet, a fighter jet, and a Formula One race car?
- ... that it's desirable for an NHRA Top Fuel dragster to race with its front wheels inches off the ground for about the first 200 feet of the run? This ensures proper weight transfer to the rear wheels, a crucial part of a good launch and quick run.
