Our Guest Speaker for May 5 Meeting Becca Monopoli

Our guest speaker is an outstanding local racer, Becca Monopoli.

Becca is a Lakeland Fla. native with ten years of racing experience on Central Florida tracks. In her first season of racing in 2011, Monopoli won Florida's state points championship for Legends racing and Auburndale Speedway's driver of the year award.

The 31-year-old has moved up to the Pro Truck series and done extremely well. In the 2019 season, she won the Auburndale Pro Truck track championship. At that point in her racing career, she had 14 track titles to her credit. She has also seen success behind the wheel of a Super Late Model.

Becca is a graduate of Daytona State College with a degree in interior design.

The dirt racetrack turned into a mud pit and the ensuing rains forced a postponement until Monday. With a field of mostly non-dirt drivers, the learning curve was huge and many never learned. Most of the favorites wrecked, leaving Logano as the winner.

With three races to go in the Spring Segment, picking a winner becomes even more important. Remember, the top three will move on to the Playoff Segment.
