The "Big Deal" in April ... we sponsored a Winner"!

Jeff Choquette, driving The Villages Motor Racing Fan Club-sponsored No. 92 entry, led over 80 laps en route to an impressive win in the April 28 Sunoco Sunbelt Super Series event at New Smyrna Speedway. After qualifying on the pole with a fast time of 17.228 seconds on the half mile asphalt oval, Choquette was awarded a fifth-place starting spot in the inversion draw. He patiently picked off the front runners until taking the lead on lap 44 and never looking back, building a 4-second lead over a highly-talented field of Sunbelt Series drivers.





The April 28 event marked a milestone for The Villages Motor Racing Fan Club, and 66 club members were on hand to celebrate with Choquette and car owner Dick Anderson. Anderson, Wildwood resident and long-time Florida stock car racing legend, welcomed the club into the Speedway's Victory Circle, thanking the club for its support of his racing programs. "We saw a great opportunity for The Villages Club to get closer to the action by joining in sponsorship of our car", he commented in his Victory Circle interview, adding that "New Smyrna Speedway and its General Manager Don Nerone did a great job in hosting the group."




