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Daytona...Here We Come!!!





July 3, 2010—at 2:00 pm sharp, the bus rolled from Laurel Manor Rec Center parking lot with 30 club members and guests on board, bound for what was expected to be an action-packed day at Daytona International Speedway. Despite some serious heat and humidity and a 90-minute rain delay, the Coke Zero 400 did not disappoint this marauding band of race fans who returned to The Villages almost 14 hours later—exhausted, but at the same time wired with a full set of racing memories that will last them a long while. If you watched the race broadcast, you know the highlights, and you may have even seen a yellow shirt or two in the stands (they really do make a statement!) In the next few days, we'll publish a recap of the day's experience, including many, many photos (Wendy took a few hundred herself, including the shot of the scoring pylon above...look who's in first on lap 121). July Meeting Preview

Dick Anderson Brings Home a Fourth Place Finish

Battling an ill-handling race car, oppressive heat and humidity, and a full field of talented Super Late Model competitors, Wildwood's Dick Anderson put on a strong showing in the June 11 Orange Blossom 100 at Orlando Speedworld. Anderson converted a mediocre qualifying run—he placed 11th out of 24 cars entered in the field—into a solid fourth place finish at the end of the grueling 100-lap contest that saw the starting field reduced to eight cars running at the end.

"We missed a little on our set-up," commented Anderson. "Putting on sticker tires for the race didn't give us the edge we were looking for, and wound up making the car run entirely too tight." During practice sessions the night before and earlier in the day, Anderson's No. 92 was the class of the field on Orlando's tight % mile asphalt oval where a tight-handling car equals passing difficulties.

Anderson ran in the top 10 through most of the race, dodging a rash of accidents that produced 17 caution periods, three of which resulted in red flags to stop the cars for clean-up of major wrecks. As the race moved into its final ten laps, he moved into the top five, and then to third place on lap 92, when he was the victim of a bump-and-spin incident while making a front stretch power bid for second place over Joe Winchell of Dade City. On the lap 93 restart, he moved quickly from 6th place in the running order to 4th, earning a solid finish in the first 100-lap event on his comeback tour.

Longwood, Florida's Tim Russell—a perennial favorite in the Super Late Model ranks at many race tracks—led the first half of the event before being caught up in a major accident late in the race. Russell started on the pole for the event, but was credited with an 11th place finish. Veterans David Rogers of Orlando and Winchell finished first and second, with Huntsville, Florida's Marty Pierce coming home third followed by Anderson, with Jared Allison of Cocoa, Florida rounding out the top five. Rogers set the fastest qualifying time, laying down a 13.4 second lap—100.7 miles per hour—on the slick asphalt surface.

Anderson's fourth place finish in the June 11 event, coupled with his four feature wins this year, place him first in the points standings for Super Late Models at Orlando Speedworld. He presently maintains an 18-point lead over second place Ben Kennedy of Daytona, Florida. Anderson continues to show the local racing

world that "once a racer, always a racer." Does it bother him competing against drivers less than half his age? "No," Anderson asserts. "In fact, at the finish of the Orange Blossom, I felt like I was 25 again!"

About 18 club members made the trip to Orlando on June 11 to support Anderson in his bid for another win. Our club logo was on the car—we put it on the back bumper so more cars could see it as they followed Dick! Anyway, before arriving at Speedworld, our spirited group made a side trip to Hooter's Restaurant in Waterford Lakes (see photo below), where we had an enjoyable pre-race strategy session. Everybody basically behaved, although there were some tense moments. At the track, we had an unexpected Matt Bowers encounter...Matt was serving as a member of Dick's pit crew, and made a trip over to the grandstands to spend some time with us. Mother Nature Wins Feature at New Smyrna

With a full field of cars assembled, and with a full grandstand of spectators gathered for one of the season's most anticipated local stock car racing events, the reality of summer weather in Florida took control and forced cancellation of the Clyde Hart Memorial/Sunoco Florida All Stars Tour (Sunoco FAST) July 1 at New Smyrna Speedway. After waiting out intermittent showers and after monitoring weather stations for several hours, speedway officials pulled the plug on racing activities at about 9:30 pm, announcing that the prestigious event had been rescheduled for Saturday, September 4, 2010.

Breaks in the weather earlier in the evening had allowed race entries to qualify for starting spots in the 100-lap event, with Austin Kirkpatrick of Ocala leading the way in a car prepared by Wildwood, Florida's Wayne

Anderson. Kirkpatrick laid down a blistering 17.589 second lap (102.337 mph) around the halfmile asphalt oval, while Anderson was fourth fastest, posting a time of 17.719 seconds (101.586 mph). Sumter County was also represented by Florida standout driver B.J. McLeod of Wachula, driving the famous No. 92 Super Late Model entry owned and prepared by Dick Anderson, also of Wildwood. The third generation of racing Andersons, Randy, was also in the mix, qualifying seventh fastest at 17.813 (101.050 mph).

The race would have been the sixth stop on the Sunoco FAST 2010 tour. The next race in the series is scheduled for Saturday, August 7 at Citrus County Speedway over in Inverness. Wayne

Anderson continues to hold down first place in the series points, with Kirkpatrick second and Randy Anderson third. A total of 10 races make up the 2010 schedule, with the final race scheduled for October 16 at Desoto Superspeedway in Bradenton, Florida.

Well, here's a recap, courtesy of the Jayski's® NASCAR Sprint Cup Silly Season Site, of the commercial airtime from the 2010 Lenox Industrial Tools 301 held June 26 at Loudon, NH. It's sort of interesting, but mind-boggling at the same time.

- Total air time 184 minutes (1:00 to 4:04)
- Total race broadcast time 123 minutes
- Total commercial time 61 minutes
 In other words one minute of commercials for example of commercials for example of commercials.

In other words one minute of commercials for every two minutes of race broadcast.

- Total number of commercials —124
- Total number of companies/entities represented 62
- Total number of brief promos of products/services during the race broadcast — 46 (they involved 17 individual sponsors and consumed an additional 5 minutes and 15 seconds of your attention)
