

HONEY ORANGE CHICKEN BREAST

4 Boneless skinless chicken breast

Salt and pepper to taste

1/2 cup honey mustard

1 tablespoon ground pepper

1 tablespoon minced garlic

1/4 orange marmalade

Clean and rinse chicken breasts. Apply a very light coating of salt and pepper over chicken, and gently rub in. Combine the remaining items, and marinate the chicken in the mix for several hours. Grill or bake until done. Baste with remaining sauce while cooking.

Hint: Try cutting the cooked chicken into strips and serving over a salad.
