County Speedway

"The First Lady of Firsts"



It's difficult to put into a summary all of the accomplishments of Mrs. Betty Skelton Erde, world famous aviatrix and motorsports luminary. Betty graced us with a visit at our August 26 meeting, sharing numerous stories about her illustrious career in aviation and racing and providing many insights into her storied life in the public eye. Interjecting personal stories and anecdotes into a narrated recap of her achievements, she provided a riveting portrayal of a woman succeeding in maledominated sporting arenas, defying the odds time and time again to accumulate an incredible list of records, firsts, and simply outstanding feats in airplanes and cars. The record books show that she started young, becoming the first woman ever to execute a solo flight at the age of 12 (by her own admission, and illegally!) From there, and with the support of her parents, Betty

Our August 26 meeting also featured a visit from The Villages Daily Sun's Associate Managing Editor, Keith Chartrand. As many of you know, Keith is an award-winning journalist with the Daily Sun, having received numerous commendations here in Florida after migrating from the north. His most recent accolades include the Florida Press Club 2008 Excellence in Journalism award for Sports Feature Writing and the 2008 Florida Society of News Editors Journalism award for sports writing. Keith is well known in local sports circles, and is recognized by our club as the guy that routinely reports our "Prediction Row" NASCAR forecasts!

What many of you did not know, however, is that prior to joining The Villages Daily Sun, Keith was an Associate Director and Assignment Editor at ESPN in Connecticut. During his seven year stay

embarked on a long string of assaults on standing records in aviation and motorsports, guided by a motto that seemed to go something like this: "That looks interesting...I think I'll do it!"

Over the course of the several decades, Betty systematically established a worldwide presence in the aviation and automotive industries. One media quote reports that "Between 1948 and 1970, Betty Skelton Erde held more combined land records and more air records than any other woman."

In addition to her daring exploits behind the wheel and in the cockpit, Betty also put together a stellar career in the business sector. As a successful business professional, she served General Motors, Chrysler Corporation, and other major companies as an advertising executive. In addition, she proved to be an accomplished real estate executive and founded her own firm.

I could go on and on, but I expect you get the picture at this point...she's something special. She's also a Villager, and has bestowed on our club the distinct honor of being the final organization from which she will accept a "Hall of Fame" invitation. We consider this to be high praise from someone of this stature, and look forward to our December 1 Hall of Fame night and Betty's induction.

In the meantime, Here's a *partial* list of Betty's major accomplishments during her career:

- to be inducted into the National Corvette Hall of Fame of the Corvette Museum
- ullet to break an auto land speed record three times
- to fly a plane upside-down cutting a ribbon 10' above the ground
- to drive "jump boats" over ramps at Cypress Gardens
- to win International Feminine Aerobatic Championship three times

with ESPN, Keith got a solid, behind-the-scenes look at the workings of NASCAR by serving as a liaison between the on-site production crews covering races and ESPN's home base in Connecticut. To the delight of our members, he described the intricate planning and coordination that goes along with covering a race, and provided a series of amusing anecdotes about the logistics of orchestrating multiple in-car cameras during a race.

Keith also shared his experience as a participant in NASCAR's Media Day at Daytona, describing his "rookie" performance during an interview with Dale Earnhardt Jr. and his most memorable encounter with the ever-gentle, media-friendly Tony Stewart. Despite these experiences (you had to be at the meeting to hear him tell it), he continues to progress as a developing race fan. He's even picked a favorite driver (Jeff Burton), and explained that his selec-

tion is based on his personal views on the importance of decorum and humility. Keith concluded his remarks with an entertaining recap of two events that drove him from the world of television--the coverage of Indiana Coach Bobby Knight's "third strike your out" performance, and the L.A. Lakers' first championship win with Koby Bryant and Shaquille O'Neill on the roster. These events, and the accompanying "all nighters," led him to leave the live TV arena and head for Florida.

A Website for Fans of Old-Time Racing!

For those of you who are fans of the "good old days" of stock car racing, this site is worth a visit. Just like our club, this group is a vibrant, active assembly of veterans in all sorts of racing venues, and they have a mission. Their official name is "Daytona Antique Auto Racing Association" (DAARA), and this excerpt from their website will put their mission in perspective: "...to preserve the history of automobile racing by ... by restoring antique race cars (primarily midgets, sprints, stock cars, and modifieds) thirty years and older, displaying these cars at race tracks and other shows, to inform the general public of this period of automobile history and to provide the opportunity to run your antique race cars within a controlled, safe program."

On Saturday, August 22, DAARA appeared at Citrus County Speedway and, as their mission states, they do offer members an opportunity to actually race their restored vehicles in competition, and I mean *race*! The 2009 NASCAR season is hurtling toward its "Chase" playoff, and all eyes are on the regular season finale at Richmond. Given the excitement that is expected as the 12-car field gets set, we thought we'd give you a little help in handicapping the results of the "Chevy Rock n' Roll 400" at Richmond. The chart below, courtesy of www.driveraverages.com, will give you a perspective on who runs well (like Stewart and Gordon) and who doesn't (like Edwards and Biffle) at Richmond. Note: these stats reflect racing results since February 2007 or, in other words, the last five races at Richmond). This list includes the top 30 average finishers; the only other Chase contender not on this list is Juan Pablo Montoya, who has an average finish of 27.80.

Coming Event—Festival of Speed in Orlando

For those of you with an interest in exotic cars, vintage automotive designs, and Speed Channel's "Supercars Exposed" series, the October 25 edition of the "Festival of Speed" at Orlando's Ritz-Carlton Grande Lakes just might be for you. The event will feature a display of some of the rarest engine-powered machines in existence. This excerpt from the Festival's website puts the event in total perspective: "...attendees enjoy a gathering of the worlds finest automobiles, motorcycles & watercraft. Vehicles are placed for display on the perfectly manicured grounds of this magnificent property. Attendees will enjoy on site cafes serving the finest culinary offerings, VIP Cafes, smooth jazz in the gardens, wine tastings, cigar smokes, luxury lifestyle displays, Fashion shows and more."

The Festival is actually a three-day event, beginning Friday, October 23 with a "Jetport Reception" and a Saturday, October 24 "Wine Dinner" at the hotel. The actual car, motorcycle, and watercraft show runs 10:00 am to 4:00 pm on Sunday, October 25. Admission for the Sunday show is \$12.00 (and there is a 20% discount available to AAA members...just show your card at the door.)

Pre-event publicity for the event notes that SPEED CHANNEL is scheduled to be on-hand to film portions of the Sunday show. Also, the website for the Festival (www.festivalsofspeed.com) indicates that "manufacturers will be operating special 'Ride and Drives' for qualified drivers...." Now I ask you, who would be more qualified than a member of The Villages Motor Racing Fan Club? Anyway, it sounds like this might be an event worth taking a look at.

DAARA and Citrus County Speedway... **An Exciting Combination!**


It wasn't your typical Saturday night stock car racing over at Citrus County Speedway in Inverness on August 22. In fact, race fans who braved the threatening skies were treated to not only the fierce competition that comes from the speedway's regular schedule, but a bonus class as well—a visit form the Daytona Antique Auto Racing Association (DAARA). Touring in its Southern Vintage Series, DAARA brought a field of about two dozen cars to the speedway to present a competitive display of racing the way it once was—in the cars that routinely ran local tracks in the 50s,60s, and 70s. And this was no

exhibition-type event—they were really racing, banging and trading paint just like any other stock car racing series!

On hand for the evening of racing was current DAARA president Bill Wendt, fresh off a trip to Utah's Bonneville Salt Flats earlier in the month to take on the world speed record for midget cars. On August 13, he and his race team set a new world record of 136.094 in a 1956 Offy-powered midget vintage oval track car, competing in a field of more than 500 entries. Bill, a former NHRA Funny Car competitor, brought his 1946 Hilligas V8-60 midget to Citrus County to take part in the night's events, and to participate in the display of vintage cars set up in the speedway's pit area. The car was restored by Bill in 2004 and, at the tender age of 64, he launched his career as an oval track racer! Now 69 years young, Bill continues to com-



pete in the Southern Vintage Series, and was one of the on-track competitors at Inverness on August 22.



tingent that arrived at Citrus County Speedway on August 22 had several, one of which involves a racing grandmother, former school teacher, and current blueberry farmer named Janis Strickland. A native Floridian currently living in Plant City, Janis began her racing career a mere three years ago on local road-racing circuits, but stepped up to oval racing this year when her husband, Fred, re-built a midget car for



her 60th birthday. "I'm having the time of my life," quipped Janis as she climbed into the cockpit of the Alpha-Romeo powered car to run in the first heat race of the night.

Christened the "Blonde Comet" and numbered 60 in honor of her reer-starting age, both driver and car made an impressive showing Citrus County Speedway's asphalt track. By the way, she's looking ward to competing in drag racing events, as soon as husband Fred completes the conversion of a 1972 Opal GT to track-ready form!

Be sure to catch the DAARA contingent next time they're in our area. It's "old time" racing at its best. And if you like this sort of thing, DAARA oversees the Zephyrhills AutoFest scheduled for vember 12-15 at Festival Park in Zephyrhills .
