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November Meeting Recap

November 3—It was another night of exploring new motorsports venues for our group, with Villages Resident Joe Eytalis providing a lively look-see into several previously uncharted waters. Using a series of video segments assembled by his son Ben, affiliated with NBC's Tampa Channel 8, Joe took us on a tour of several fascinating subjects, including:

 Billetproof—a traveling hot rod show featuring a recent visit to Big Daddy Don Garlits' Belleview museum, along with some shots of Garlits' Swamp Rat VIII rail dragster.



- Drag Racing—A segment filmed at Lakeland Speedway's dragstrip, with Joe himself behind the wheel!
- Autocross—A segment from PCA Autocross at Zephyrhills, with Joe behind the wheel. The clip featured in-car camera footage to help you get the feel for driving the course.
- Pocketbikes—or minimotos, or whatever else you'd want to call them! Imagine, racing something at speeds up to 50 mph, 16" to 18" off of the ground.
- Wagon Rods—Proving you can turn just about anything into a racing machine, one of Ben's tv segments featured traditional Red Flyer wagons converted to real racing machines!
- Ford GT Drive—A wild, birds' eye view of what it's like to drive a Ford GT on a road course.

The entertaining discussing led off with a short feature on the correct way to adjust rearview mirrors for maximum safety...another segment prepared by Ben for his Channel 8 show "Auto Focus."

It was not to be, however, as the recently reconstructed No. 92 encountered pre-race problems and, after taking the green, was forced to pit under caution for adjustments. Running deep in the field, Scofield fell victim to a race-ending wreck on lap 42.

Oh, well...we'll get 'em next year!

Things didn't fare much better for the rest of the Wildwood contingent, with heavily favored Wayne Anderson succumbing to mechanical problems on lap 169, after running in the top 5 most of the race. Randy Anderson likewise experienced mechanical issues, and was unable to take the green, pulling into the infield during the parade laps.

Another Assault on The Guinness Book of Records

The Long View An Editorial by Ron Hedger

November 3—National Speed Sports News (NSSN) columnist Ron Hedger (right) is a frequent visitor to our club meetings, and will soon become a resident of The Villages (and a member of our club). He joined us at our November meeting and took advantage of the opportunity to spend a few moments with Dick Anderson...always a source of good material for any racing-related publication! Here's a draft copy of Ron's NSSN column recapping his conversation with the legendary Anderson, used with permission of the author.



One tenet that's served us well over the years is never passing up the opportunity to listen to a legend in the sport. With that in mind, we recently attended the monthly meeting of The Villages Motor Racing Fan Club to hear Dick Anderson tell members about his plans for the upcoming Governor's Cup at New Smyrna. His recitation of changes in the race's format was interesting, as was his description of rebuilding his severely wrecked #92 for former winner Jeff Schofield to run in the Governor's Cup, but the stories we drew out in the one-on-one that followed gave us a much better understanding of the man.

Anderson, who'll turn 62 the week of the Governor's Cup, told us he hadn't been behind the wheel for a long while until a friend approached him about a comeback a few months ago. "I told him I'd need two things – sponsorship and losing about 40 pounds – before I'd consider it," recalled the Wildwood resident. "The next morning he called and said he had the money and had also convinced a local weight clinic to work with me. Pretty soon I was down 35 pounds and back racing. I got wrecked the first night back taking the lead, then won the next four races at Speed World in Orlando. Then he called and told me his business was down and he couldn't afford the sponsorship anymore and the deal fell apart. "Now I'm back to putting guys who pay in my car to keep us going but for a while, I felt like I'd never been gone." While he's quick to say that Schofield is very talented, Anderson also laments the way racing has changed. "It used to be that if you had talent, you didn't need money to race. Now it's the exact opposite for most guys."

A question about how many features he's won over the years brings a big laugh from Anderson, at the same time triggering some interesting comments on racing history. "I'd won over 1000 races when I retired. But when I got to 1000, Dick Trickle raised his total to 1100, even though he hadn't been racing. But he's a great guy who won a lot more big races than I did. He'd take me around for two or three weeks when I went to Wisconsin, telling me about the different tracks where he raced, and I'd take him around when he came down here. "One thing for sure is that he won the most parties. Nobody, including Richie Evans, could keep up with Dick. We'd be swallowing sugar packs and needing toothpicks to keep our eyes open and he'd go out and lead 200 or 300 laps like it was nothing. That was his life!

"I really miss racing and carrying on with Richie. Most years he'd win the modified title in February at New Smyrna and I'd win the Late Models." The mention of the perennial NASCAR modified champion brings to mind one of Evan's few complaints, that in the battle for NASCAR's national short track championship, southern drivers like Mike Alexander generally started on the pole after turning fast time while he always started in the rear due to the northeast's handicapped starts. "When I was racing, we mostly had handicapped starts by points," offered Anderson. "I passed a lot of cars to get most of those wins but Richie was right that many tracks didn't use a handicap. On the one hand it's unfair to penalize a guy for having a fast car by making him start in the rear but putting the fast guys up front does give the fans a poor show most nights. They're using a system down here now where they invert from six to ten cars by a draw, which makes the race more interesting and still gives the fast guy a chance to pick number one."

With that, a fan club member interceded to say he'd seen Anderson race at New York's Orange County Speedway years ago and remembered it well. "Yeah, I ran there and at Nazareth back in the 70's," explained Anderson. "I was up there with Will Cagle and Buzzie Reutimann and all the others guys from down here. Cagle was hell on wheels up north. I still see him in Tampa and go to the dog races with him. Will loves the dog races. And Buzzie and I have lunch together every so often. He's still having as much fun racing as he ever did."

With that, Anderson heads back to his shop to get ready for the Governor's Cup. "Come over to Wildwood sometime and see my photos on the wall," he suggests as he leaves. "I've got shots of those guys and my cars over the years and you'll really enjoy it. And my son's shop is right down the road. He's had a great career too and my grandson, who's 16, is running good in the Super Late Models."

It looks like Dick Anderson will be in racing for a long time yet, which is good. That's where legends belong!
