Our guest speaker is the renowned motorsports photographer, Bill Watson.

We first met Bill in January 2020 when he introduced the keynote speaker, Harlan Hunter, at our Hall of Fame Induction Ceremony.

Bill was on the Indianapolis 500 Motor Speedway Photography Staff from 1964 to 2012/2013 and has photographed over 65 Indy 500 races. He is a 50+ year member of the Indianapolis 500 Oldtimers Club. From 1964 to 2012/2013, Bill has photographed all the Indy 500, NASCAR Brickyard 400, Formula 1 Grand Prix, and Moto GP Motorcycle events held at the Indianapolis Motor Speedway. He also has covered numerous Daytona 500, Daytona 400, and Rolex 24 Hour races, plus NASCAR races at Talladega and Atlanta.

Bill's images have been published worldwide in books, magazines, street banners, displays in the Lucas Fieldhouse, Naval Museums, and limited issue posters, as well as multiple websites and Facebook pages.

(first 13 races) took a crazy turn in March when predictors Larry Hanna, Jackie Putman, Art Staus, Carol Wagner, Jim West and Woody White were faced with multiple races during a weekend, as well as multiple races during the week. Larry Hanna, Art Staus and Jim West successfully picked the most winners and moved on to compete in the Playoffs Segment.

During the Summer Segment's 13 races, again with crazy schedules, John Goodyear, Donna Gross, Gerry Hafer, Paul O'Connor, Steve Poplarski and defending champion, Bob Woodsford, competed. Moving on to the Playoffs Segment were John Goodyear, Gerry Hafer, and Steve Poplarski.

The Prediction Row championship was very competitive, even after the last race at Phoenix. Gerry Hafer and John Goodyear both had three wins, so the winner was decided by points. The final wins/points are as follows: Gerry Hafer, 3 wins with 418 points; John Goodyear, 3 wins with 406 points; Larry Hanna, 2 wins and 398 points; Steve Poplarski, 2 wins and 371 points; Jim West, 2 wins and 335 points; Art Staus, 1 win and 394 points.
